In case you have forgotten, Marthe was sponsored by our club from March to May, the first Congolese to receive a Royce and Jean Abbey vocational scholarship.


During her stay, HandUp Congo facilitated a program where Marthe explored women's health and livelihood projects with the goal of replicating some back home.

# The ER Co-ordinator's Report

Since its formation in 1966, RAWCS has processed about half a billion dollars in project donations, delivering thousands of international development projects and engaged tens of thousands of Rotary volunteers. The project impacts have saved and enhanced countless lives in fifty developing nations and continues to be strongly supported today. At the end of 2023-24 Eastern Region had 124 active overseas aid projects representing 40% of the total Overseas Aid Fund (OAF) projects. Similarly Eastern Region has a significant number of Rotary Australia Benevolent Society (RABS) projects, 17 projects representing 31% of the RABS projects and 15 Rotary Australia Compassionate Grants (RACG) projects (44%).



During the past year the Board has endorsed several strategic initiatives aimed at underpinning the sustainability

of our organisation and supporting clubs provide community service, as well as continuously improving our systems and efficiency. These include seeking reaccreditation with the Australian Council for International Development which once accreditation is achieved will provide the opportunity for clubs to apply for government grants for their projects. The Board has been modernising the RAWCS accounting system and further developing the communications channels. The Board has also appointed a part-time Fund-Raising Manager and is committed to engaging with external funding and project delivery partners.

#### **Volunteer Travel Support**

RAWCS has been investigating ways to assist volunteers to travel to their overseas projects and to provide well-deserved benefits and discounts. Last year, 67 teams consisting of 343 Rotarians travelled to work on RAWCS projects and it is estimated that about \$1.2 million was spent on travel costs.

After reviewing various options, the RAWCS Board identified Flight Centre (known as FCM) as the company to provide "bulk discounts" anticipated to range from 12% to 20% on airfare and accommodation. Information on how to take advantage of the benefits has been sent to project managers and team volunteer members. RAWCS has created an organisation-wide account with FCM to facilitate the discount. FCM will make the account details available to project managers and volunteers to take advantage of the discounts FCM are providing.

#### Rotary Australia Trust for the Environment (RATE)

RAWCS has now established a charitable trust to support and facilitate environmental projects of Rotary clubs. The trust to be known as Rotary Australia Trust for the Environment (RATE) is registered with the Australian Charities and Not-for-profits Commission (ACNC) as a charity. RAWCS will issue tax deductible receipts for donations to projects registered as RATE projects in the same way as RAWCS issues tax deductible receipts for donations for OAF and RABS projects.

The principal purpose of the RATE is the protection and enhancement of all aspects of the natural environment both in Australia and in developing nations by delivering project activities relating to air and water quality, waste minimisation, soil conservation, protection and restoration of land, coastal, marine and freshwater resources and promotion of ecologically sustainable development principles. RATE projects can also support the provision of information or education, or the carrying on of research, about the natural environment or a significant aspect of the natural environment.

The project activities must relate to the natural environment as distinct from other types of environments such as built, cultural and historic environments. 'Natural environment' includes all aspects of the natural surroundings of humans, whether affecting them as individuals or in social groupings. It can include:

- 1. Significant natural areas and ecological zones, such as rainforests
- 2. Wildlife and their habitats
- 3. Issues affecting the environment such as air and water quality, waste minimisation, soil conservation, and biodiversity and
- 4. Promotion of ecologically sustainable development principles.

#### **RAWCS Logo Competition**

RAWCS has been using "We back doing good" as a tagline on the logo. Rotary International has requested this tagline be phased out. As such the RAWCS Board is in the process of drafting up a new tagline and has launched a competition for the new tagline. ### 200 Child Victims of War Equipped for School

District 9685 and The Rotary Club of Kowloon Golden Mile co-funded the provision of 200 SchoolKits to children in Goma, DRC.

The children have recently fled the violence of armed militia on foot, with only what they could carry. Local schools are trying to accomodate them without fees, even though the government funding, which is supposed to pay teachers, is very unreliable. The schools do not have books or paper or writing tools to spare for children arriving without so the provision of bags, new uniforms and school supplies feels like a small miracle to them.

Water is in short supply for the refugees, requiring long waits at the communal pump some distance from their tents and shelters. This makes laundry extremely difficult when children are wearing their only uniform for 6 days running. Scabies thrives and spreads under these conditions and the new unifoms will help to control this pest, which leaves children vulnerable to other infections.

The bags and uniforms are sewn in Goma by the Mama Wimbi sewing team equipped, trained in the SewAid workshop. The team were subsisting by begging but have been progressing towards independence through their work and setting a good example for their own children.

# Transforming Education through Smartboards and Spoken English Training



The Rotary E-Club of Greater Sydney, in collaboration with the Rotary Club of The Hills-Kellyville and the Rotary Club of Colombo Regency, has delivered an impactful project bringing Smart Interactive Boards and Spoken English Training to three schools in remote and underserved areas of Sri Lanka.

This initiative, supported by the Rotary Foundation and the Sri Lankan diaspora, exemplifies how global partnerships can drive meaningful change in local communities.

The smartboards provide access to a vast array of curriculum

resources, enabling teachers to deliver lessons more effectively. For students from economically disadvantaged backgrounds, this technology offers an opportunity to experience a modern learning environment, bridging the educational gap between rural and urban areas.

In tandem with the smartboard initiative, Spoken English Training programs are being conducted across schools in Sri Lanka's Eastern, Northern, and Upcountry regions.

These programs are designed to help students gain the confidence to communicate effectively in English, a critical skill for accessing higher education, career opportunities, and global platforms.

In-country, the Rotary Club of Colombo Regency and its members, led by Rtn. Anura, ensured the successful delivery of this project. Their dedication and coordination with local schools exemplify Rotary's commitment to service above self.
